Friday, January 22 and Friday, January 29 Asynchronous days

Monday, January 25 - Tuesday, February 2 Synchronous days

Wednesday, February 3 Return to In-person learning

There will be no athletics or activities today. However, athletics and activities will resume tomorrow for students who are not considered, by the school's standards, to have been in close contact with a COVID-19 positive individual. As you know, Immaculata's standards are directed by the Somerset County Department of Health and the Diocese of Metuchen. Close contact letters are forthcoming.

The school building will be open tomorrow and next week from 8 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., if a student needs to pick up books for school work.

The good news is we are just entering the second semester so we still have a lot of time this school year to learn, work, play, and pray together. I am hopeful that NJ COVID-19 numbers will settle down, but it will take all of us being careful with our choices. Hang in there with us and God bless!
